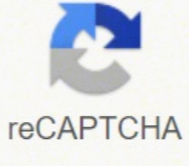

The quality was of such a level that we took the unprecedented decision to regionalise two of the categories to ensure due recognition. As a result of its latest inspection, the CQC found Pennine Acute Trust, has: maintained its Good ratings for being Caring and Well-led improved its rating for Effective services from Requires Improvement to Good improved the overall rating for Fairfield General Hospital to Outstanding rated the Trust’s End of life Palliative Care services as Outstanding rated community health inpatient services provided across Rochdale as Good improved medical care services (incl. “During this inspection we looked at the areas identified in the warning notice, and found some areas had improved,” it said.“However, there were still staff vacancies and gaps in the rota, especially during the night which could put patients at risk.“Inspectors praised some “outstanding practice”, including an initiative where health and social care staff work together when discharging patients.The trust said in response to the report it had “compiled action plans which our teams are working through in order to improve patient care and experience”. Fairfield General Hospital and the Trust’s End of Life Care are rated Outstanding. Winners will be revealed at a ceremony at the Intercontinental London hotel on 21 November. “Patients didn’t always have a dignified experience when they were being moved from one place to another within the hospital,” the inspectors said.“We saw one patient being transferred without any trousers on and no alternative covering which is totally unacceptable.“The report added that last November the trust was issued with a warning notice in medical care where there were not enough suitably skilled and competent staff to meet patients’ needs. The Trust was previously inspected in October 2017 and rated ‘Requires Improvement’. The headline sponsor is GRI (previously known as de Poel health+care).
